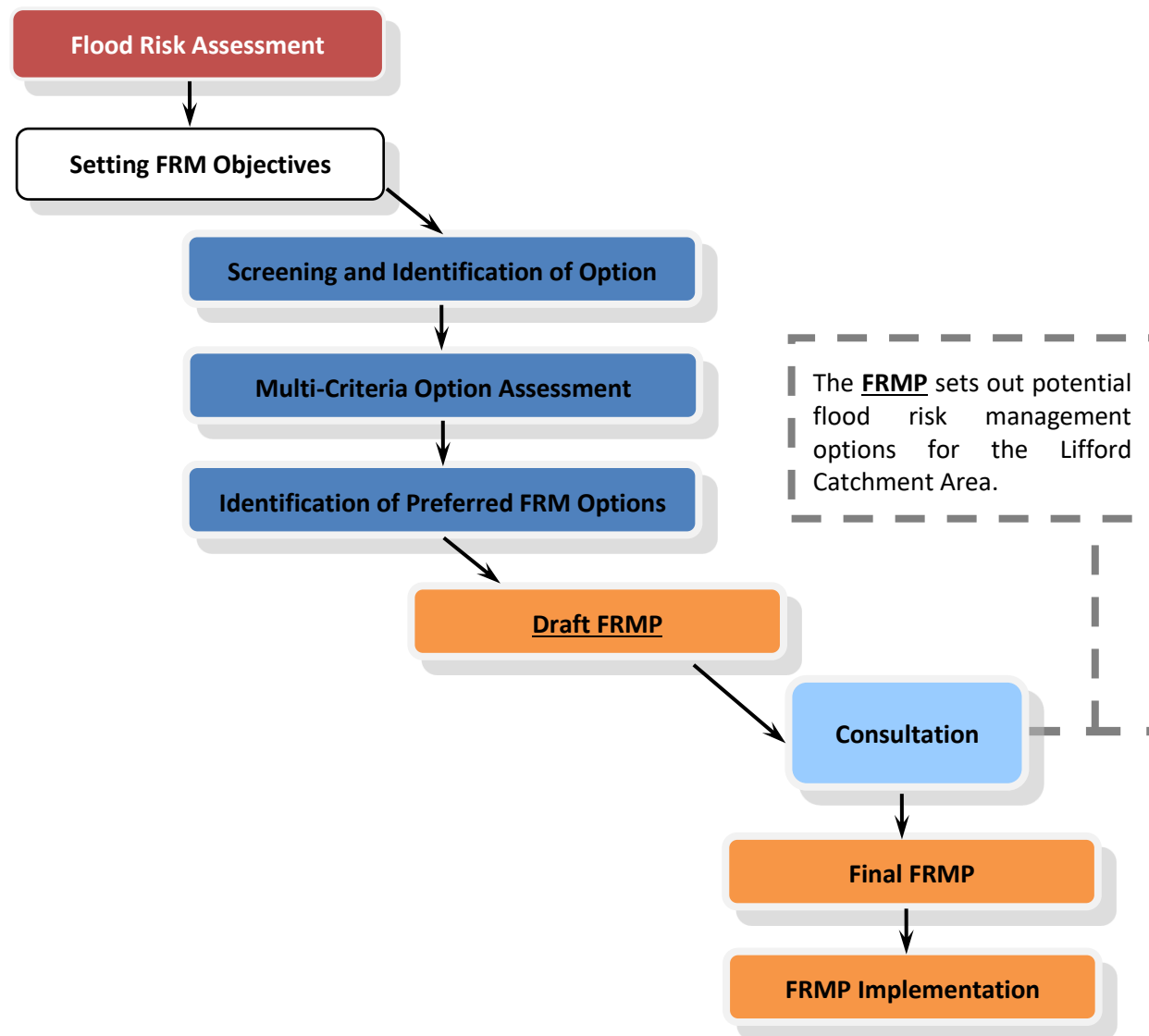


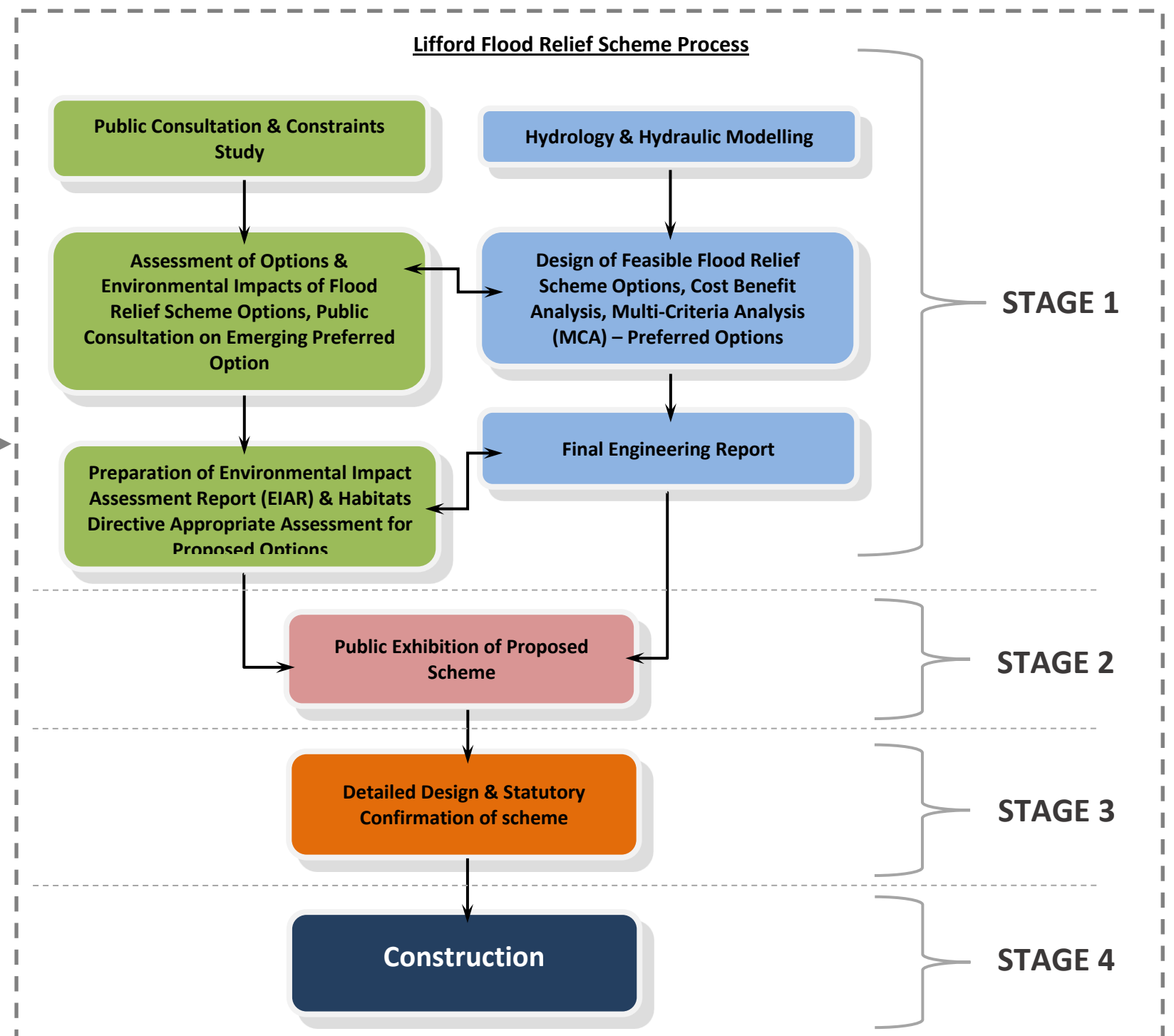
# Lifford Flood Relief Scheme

Flood Risk Management Plan Process



Lifford Flood Relief Scheme

The chart below shows how the Lifford Flood Relief Scheme follows on from the outputs of the North Western-Neagh Bann Flood Risk Management Plan (FRMP) and details the interaction between the Environmental Study and the Engineering Study for the Scheme.



**North Western - Neagh Bann Catchment and Flood Risk Assessment and Management (CFRAM) Study**

As part of the Catchment and Flood Risk Management (CFRAM) of the country, the North Western – Neagh – Bann CFRAM Study was completed with support from Donegal County Council.

Lifford town was identified as an Area of Further Assessment (AFA) due to its flood risk and a detailed flood study was undertaken. This study comprised detailed hydrologic and hydraulic assessments of the current scenario of flood risk and the proposed flood relief options for the town were determined in the North Western Flood Risk Management Plan (FRMP).

Following on from the CFRAM study and the outputs of the North Western FRMP, RPS Consulting Engineers (Civil) and Ryan Hanley Consulting (Environmental) were appointed in October 2019 to undertake the development and implementation of a flood relief scheme (FRS) for Lifford.
